2019-2020 Contracts/Agreements – Business Services

1. Air-Ex Air Conditioning, Inc. C1002194 - Facilities & Operation staff verified the repairs to the copper HVAC lines at Estudillo Elementary, North Mountain Middle School and Park Hill Elementary are complete and a Notice of Completion can be filed with the Riverside County Recorder's Office. Release of retention will be 35 days following the recording.
2. Corodata Records Management, Inc. - Corodata Records Management, Inc. will provide secure storage and retrieval of District records. Contract to be effective September 11, 2019 through September 10, 2024. Cost not to exceed \$60,000 for the term of the agreement; funded by General Fund.
