8.1. Student Board Member Update

San Jacinto High School Student Board Member Precious King commented on the following: She attended the first San Jac SPEAKS (formerly Vision 20/20) and they discussed the graduate profile with members of

the community and took points from the community, staff, parents and students. Distance Learning has been difficult but it is going better and students recognize that the district is doing all they can to provide us with the best education they can during these tough times and we appreciate it. We know our teachers are working hard, but we do look forward to being back in the classroom.

8.2. Board Member and Cabinet Reports and Comments

Minutes:

Deputy Superintendent of Personnel Dr. Sherry Smith commented on the following: As we started the Distance Learning hubs, I cannot say enough about how fantastic our classified staff have been. They have stepped up and have been more than willing to come back for our kids. We have sent 140 classified for the special credential and 61 have cleared; we held a classified training in social/emotional supports that was above and beyond and had a great turnout; we have launched our sexual misconduct training and it is starting up; Oct 5 was our aspiring administrator training with 21 in attendance; this Thursday, Oct 15 is our first drive-by COVID-19 testing at SJHS for our staff and we are focusing on our DO and management first, starting in November we are starting with the rotating testing= it was loud and clear from the county to start getting the testing now. This is the next step in keeping our families and staff safe.

Assistant Superintendent of Ed Services Mr. Roach - Our Learning Continuity Plan was submitted and we found out this afternoon and we met all the required elements and we have no corrections, very proud of our staff; next is "Ready, Set, Read" - it is our literacy initiative and you will see it on our website and banners at our school sites. We know your priority is to have all students reading by grade 3, check out our website and the resources, I want to commend Shelley Mendez for this; we have rolled out our 24/7 tutoring for grades 6-12 and initial feedback has been positive.

Assistant Superintendent of Business Services Mr. Heeren - with any luck we will be on the state allocation agenda in the next month or so for our modernization reimbursement of the matching funds; the two story modulars are starting to arrive at the new middle school.

Board Member Ojeda commented on the following: I drive by the new middle school once a week and cannot wait for it to open; I am amazed at our classified staff and teachers and what they can do virtually.

Board Clerk Rex - I really appreciate Serenity for setting up the flu shots for staff they are not just for Kaiser folks, but for any of our staff. I was over by De Anza and saw kids going to school and they were so excited; I appreciate Chawn for helping me last week, it is sometimes a challenge with the technology and I appreciate the creative ways to connect. (I was using my phone)

Board Member Rubio commented on the following: Attended a meeting regarding a program new to the valley they bring DAs and other resources thank-you to Mtn. View and SJHS; Isaac Cruz a former student passed away from a car accident last month after surviving childhood cancer, his mother is a former SJUSD employee. I saw many of our administrators that supported the family and thank you for everything you do for our kids.

Board President Norman commented on the following: I want to give

another shout out to Nutrition Services, they start around 6:00 am setting up and I could not be more proud of the time and work they put in to make sure our kids are fed. They do a great job!

The big news - when can we return and have students back in the classroom? It is really up to the county and the state and of course, safety is our priority. Riverside County is remaining in the red tier one more week to see if they can reduce the cases. They appreciate the one-week extension from the state. We are cautiously optimistic and we are now in our 5th week in our cohort which is taking off some of the pressure. We are hoping for good news.
